Job Description:

Job Title: Director of Religious Education (Half Time)

Reports to: Minister

Position Purpose and Scope of Responsibility:

The DRE is responsible for the leadership and coordination of the Religious Education Program for children and youth at UUCL. The DRE provides inspiration and resources while collaborating with our Minister, other staff and religious education volunteers to develop, plan and implement religious education programming.. The DRE manages paid staff providing nursery care for infants and toddlers.

Roles and Responsibilities:

Planning

~Works in collaboration with the RE Team to plan, implement and evaluate RE programs (Sunday morning Religious Education, Youth Group, Our Whole Lives, and Coming of Age).

~Manages paid nursery staff including recruitment, appointment, scheduling, training, evaluation and dismissal.

~Schedules and manages volunteer and/or paid staff for Children's Activity time when children aged 4-9 years are sung out of the Worship Service.

~Provides resources to and collaborates with volunteer RE Team and teachers to choose programs and curricula.

~Promotes a safe environment for children and families in accordance with the UUCL Safe Congregation Policy.

~Collaborates with the Minister in integrating children and youth into Sunday Worship Service themes.

Leadership:

~Promotes and maintains a welcoming environment for children and families.

~Recruits and trains volunteer teachers and youth leaders in safety practices, program development and

curriculum delivery.

~Empowers parents and volunteers to make their own contributions to the program. Advocates for the needs of and programming for UUCL's infants, children and youth. Maintains a presence on Sundays to support RE classes, teachers,,children and parents and to assist in welcoming new or visiting families. See schedule below.

~Collaborates with RE Team to develop RE annual budget and manages the RE budget to accomplish goals within allocated resources.

~Refers families, children and youth in need of pastoral care to minister.

Communication & Administration:

~Publicizes the RE Program to the congregation and community at large through the newsletter and website contributions and weekly e-blast of schedule,

~Makes monthly reports to the UUCL Board, and an annual report to the congregation.

~Maintains active communication with parents and volunteers regarding RE programming and opportunities.

~Attends weekly staff meetings, RE Team meetings, and UUCL Annual Meeting. Other occasional commitments to coordinate RE with UUCL activities and aid in exchange of information will be required. ~Plans, organizes and oversees all RE registration procedures and maintains records of attendance. ~Oversees the state of the RE classrooms and the availability of basic materials and equipment.

Professional Development:

Maintains membership in Liberal Religious Educators Association (LREDA) and active involvement with the larger UU community. Attendance of out-of-town training, UUA Renaissance modules and/or conferences as circumstances as budget permits.. Seeks out ongoing knowledge and resources on anti-oppression and social justice topics in order to ensure diversity and inclusivity best practices.

Knowledge and Skill Requirements:

Minimum Qualifications: Ability to lead a Religious Education Program that is grounded in UU principles.. Working knowledge of child/youth education and experience working with children and families in a recreational or educational capacity..

Experience in organizing events and managing employees or volunteers.. Proficiency working with the public in a positive and professional manner.

Ability to take initiative to set and accomplish goals..

Proficient in Google and Microsoft Applications (i.e., Google Docs)

Preferred Qualifications: Bachelor's degree, preferably in religious studies or an education-related field or relevant experience equivalent.

Experience directing a religious education program and/or UUA Religious Educator credential.

Schedule:

Flexible schedule averaging 20 hours per week. "Office" hours to be coordinated with minister.

Present Sunday mornings with one Sunday off per month. Evening and weekend hours to accommodate meetings and special events.

Salary and benefits

Part-time, salaried position (20 hours/week). Salary commensurate with education and experience and in accordance with fair compensation guidelines..

Vacation, sick leave, health benefits and some professional development funds included. Retirement plan available after 1 year.

Evaluation:

Preliminary evaluation by Minister and HR committee after six-month probationary period and then annually thereafter.

Employment is contingent on results of criminal background check in accordance with the UUCL Safe Congregation Policy.
